- 3) **Graduation Rate** Lincoln Hill High School on time and extended graduation rate will increase by 2% per year.
- 4) **Lincoln Hill High School -** The number students with a total 10 or more unexcused absences will decrease by 10% each year on an annual basis.
- 5) **Participation Rate:** Improvement of student participation rate to meet or exceed 95% participation rate as a school.
