2022-27 STRATEGIC PLAN ADOPTION

The School Board approved the five-year District <u>Strategic Plan, 2022-2027</u>, introducing Our Promise: "Every student in the Stanwood-Camano School District is empowered to learn in an inclusive setting and is prepared for the future of their choice."

The Plan includes these four goals for student success:

- Goal 1: Every student in preschool to Grade 3 will develop the social-emotional and academic competencies critical for their future growth and development.
- Goal 2: Every student will be a learner that is empowered to advocate for and pursue their own educational passions, and to address issues in collaborative and resourceful ways.
- Goal 3: Every student will demonstrate continuous growth toward meeting academic, social-emotional, and behavioral goals, at a pace that eliminates opportunity and achievement gaps.
- Goal 4: Every student will graduate from high school with the skills, experiences, and readiness to pursue the future of their choosing.

2022-23 BUDGET APPROVED

Ruth Floyd, Executive Director of Business Services, presented the <u>budget</u>, including a public hearing. The Board approved a resolution fixing and determining fund appropriations; adopting the 2022-23 budget, the four-year budget plan summary, and the four-year enrollment projection; and providing for related matters.

POLICY 0100 EDUCATIONAL EQUITY

The Board approved Policy 0100 Educational Equity. This policy was written as a collaborative effort between the District's Equity Leadership Team and district administrators. The Equity Leadership Team reviewed policies from multiple districts within the State of Washington.

The policy begins: "We as a district are committed to an inclusive, diverse and equitable learning environment where all students and staff know they belong. We as a district will place equity at the center of all decision making and planning, ensuring that all students and staff have a voice and the resources they need to thrive academically, socially and emotionally in our schools."
